The 2010 vintage in the Northern Willamette Valley was one of the coolest vintages in recent memory. "Pretty" will often be used to describe the wines from this vintage. The 2010 LeNez Pinot Noir is perfectly balanced with pretty cherry, anise and mocha in the nose. The wine is delicate but has fine tannins adding to the mid palate and lengthy finish. This wine is approachable now, but should gain complexity with 4-7 years of bottle aging. One of my favorite LeNez bottlings to date. Because of the low yields and bird damage in 2010, we only produced half of the amount of this wine we did in 2009; 225 cases.

I recently hosted a harvest party for my friends at Owen Roe. Our tasting room bar was filled with some of the highest end Owen Roe wines, dating back to 1999. I also opened several Lenné wines and was quite taken back when Owen Roe owner and winemaker David O'Reilly pointed to the 2010 Lenné Estate and said it was the best wine there. It was indicative of how I feel about this stunning vintage. I think that the 2010 vintage will rival the 2008 vintage for best vintage of the decade, but it was certainly more dependent on having the right kind of site than the 08 vintage. This wine doesn't disappoint. Beautiful, mocha, leather, and black cherry aromas frame a wonderfully textured wine. Drinkable now but probably best in the 5-8 year range.

From the beginning, I felt that the upper northeast corner of the vineyard would produce some of our most outstanding wine. We call it "kill hill" because it was so difficult to get vines established in this very shallow, poor soil. Many vines just didn't survive and I knew that the ones that did would produce outstanding wine. The 2010 Kill Hill is a testament to the fact that poor soils produce great wine by limiting the vines vigor and forcing it to put its energy into ripening fruit. The 2010 Kill Hill is undeniably Lenné with chocolate up front and layers of flavor beneath. Black cherry and an almost boysenberry like fruit give way to a long, persistent finish, flush with fine grained tannins. Best in the 5-8 year range, but should last longer than that.

Note: If you haven't been enjoying the 2009 wines with the onset of cooler weather, you are missing out. The wines are drinking great right now.
